
Department Spotlights

Jerry Matteo, M.D. & Patrick Natter, M.D.




Dr. Jerry Matteo



August Employee of the Month




Rani Castro, RN, IR


PRC Scores

May 2012






New Radiology Dress Code for Shands Employees

Please join us for the commencement exercise of the class of 2012 that will take place on Thursday, August 23, 2012 at 7pm in the LRC auditorium. The senior's last month of school will focus on reviewing for the ARRT exam. The juniors have just completed their second quarter of training. We concentrated on the lower extremities, the pelvic girdle, the bony thorax and the vertebral column. The class of 2013 learned approximately 27 exams between April 1, 2012 and June 30, 2012! They also completed and submitted their scientific exhibits to the FSRT during this quarter. We would like to congratulate them on a job well done! Just a note about the ARRT exam for the class of 2013. The ARRT has raised the bar for the exam. Starting in 2013, a student that takes the ARRT exam will have to answer approximately 6 more questions correctly as compared to previous years. A student that scored a 75 or 76 on the registry in the past, may not pass the exam in 2013. The CT students are nearing the end of their training. PATIENT SAFETY 101: Fall Prevention

A fall is defined as “an unplanned descent to the ground or lower surface with or without injury.” All types of falls are to be reported whether they result from physiological reasons (fainting, seizure), environmental reasons (wet floors) and include “assisted” falls when a staff member attempts to minimize the impact of the fall.

The purpose of a fall prevention program is to identify patients at risk for falling, implement measures to prevent the occurrence of falls, reduce the risk of patient harm, provide comprehensive plans for caregiver, patient, and family education related to fall assessment/prevention, to provide appropriate follow-up and documentation in the event of a fall, and to develop a plan for consistent measurement of fall prevention compliance and effectiveness.
